


# Employee Spotlight



Houston Club Championship Boxing Tournament, April 20, 1961



# Featured Reciprocal Clubs

**The City Tavern Club** is a private social club located in the heart of Georgetown, in Washington, DC. The Club provides fine dining, elegantly appointed rooms for entertaining, popular member events and a diverse membership. The historic Federal-Style clubhouse, acquired by Club founders in 1959, is one of oldest buildings in the nation's capital, and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.



The City Tavern was constructed in 1796 and first managed by Clement Sewall who served in the American Revolution alongside his friend George Washington Parke Custis, George Washington's adopted son.

The City Tavern served not only as a

traditional lodging house but also as the meeting place for Georgetown's governing body, the Georgetown Corporation and the location for elections and meetings of the Mayor's Court. It also served as the terminal stop of the Georgetown-Frederick stagecoach line. Of the several taverns that were constructed in Georgetown during the founding era, the City Tavern is the only one that remains today.

History also records that the purpose of the Club was to furnish its members with cheap and well cooked dinners and "wine free of death in the bottle".

Today, from fine dining to business meeting and function facilities, members of the Western Club can enjoy professional service in elegant surroundings.

The club maintains a unique character and style whilst providing a wide range of services to satisfy members' social and business requirements.

### Nizels Golf & Country Club, Hildenborough, Kent, UK -



Situated less than 10 minutes from Tonbridge and Sevenoaks, Nizels was established in 1992 on an historic estate that dates back to 1397. It is situated on high ground

overlooking Kentish Weald countryside. The golf course is a classic English parkland design offering a tough challenge with a number of strategically placed hazards including several testing water holes.

These lines from Solomon's Proverbs, xxxi, 6,7. preface Robert Burns' pem, Scotch Drink. These lines are a fitting invitation to join the members of the Wine Committee for our annual Single Malt Tasting and Burns Dinner on Friday, January 28th, 2011 at 6pm.

Many years ago my good friend, Bear Dalton, the wine buyer at Spec's introduced me to Jim Detmore, who buys Scotch for Spec's. Through Jim Detmore's good offices, the Wine Committee arranged the first Single Malt Tasting and Dinner at The HOUSTON Club. Each year, since 1993, with the help of Jim, we have presented a fine selection of Single Malt Scotch whiskies for our Club Members and their guests. The presenter of the whiskies has been a representative of a

distributor, a representative of the distillery, and in one year the master distiller himself.

Over the years we have enjoyed Single Malt whiskies from Oban, Talisker, Glenlivet, Glenfidich, Lagavulin, Laiphrog and others. Last year the tastings were from Springbrook, the oldest-owned distillery still operating in Scotland.

The tastings have been accompanied by a significant amount of Scots pageantry. For many years until his death, our piper was Bob Roberson of the Houston Highlanders Pipe Band. Faber McMullen, who at our wedding twenty-four years ago, piped us into our wedding reception, has been invited to skirl the pipes again this year.

The Scotch tasting is followed by an elegant seven course dinner. Members of the Wine Committee have selected the wines to go with each course.

Over the years we have worked more of the poetry of Robert Burns into the evening. His birthday is the 25th of January. Burns' poems and songs and Scotch whisky seem to go well together. Other than the piper, who has skills no member of the Wine Committee possesses, we provide our own entertainment. We believe there is sufficient talent among our Club Members to continue that tradition.

Come join us as a spectator or as a performer. Our aim is to see that none go away from the evening dissatisfied.



# **LIVE Radio** Returns Downtown

# **TALK650** - Live from The HOUSTON Club - January 21, 2011

CBS Radio's Talk650 Morning Show's "Breakfast Broadcast" Series at The HOUSTON Club

Live Radio broadcasts from downtown Houston are nothing new; the city has a long and colorful telecommunications history. The first telegraph service between Houston and Galveston started in 1860, and the nation's second telephone system was installed here in 1880, the same year we started using electric street lights. The first wireless transmissions from Houston were sent in 1906, and private business like The Texas Company and The Rice Hotel installed and maintained wireless operations in 1908—as back-up systems for unreliable telephone exchanges.

According to "A History of Radio in Houston," by Christopher Varela, the Rice's owner, James Lawlor, used the hotel's wireless rig to communicate with his farm, miles away on Dairy Ashford Street.

The Hurlburt-Still Electric Company was the first Houston business with a commercial broadcast license. WEV originated from the company's store in December 1920, and in May 1922, the station's programming was sponsored by a fledgling newspaper, The Houston Evening Post.

WEAY broadcast from The Iris Theater, across the street from The Rice Hotel, in June 1922...sponsored by The Houston Post. In July The QRV Radio Company launched its station, WGAB, from its store at 1213 Prairie. The Houston Chronicle briefly held a license for WFAL.

WEAY pioneered remote broadcasting in 1924, networking with WEAF/New Jersey to carry the Heavyweight boxing title match between Luis Angel Firpo and Harry Wills. The station also broadcast dances from The Rice Hotel, and the 1924 Rice Owls/Texas Longhorn game from Rice University.

WEAY was replaced by KPRC in May 1925, broadcasting from a studio at The Houston Post. The call letters were an acronym for "Kotton, Port, Rail Center," according to Varela's book.

In 1926, KTUE began to broadcast from a spare room in the basement barbershop of the new State Hotel at the corner of Rusk and Fannin, with transmitter equipment atop the Houston Chronicle. In 1930 the station changed its call letters to KXYZ, with a new transmitter on The Gulf Building.

KTRH began to operate in March 1930 from Jesse Jones' Rice Hotel—the call letter acronym: "Kome To Rice Hotel."

According to Bruce Williamson's HoustonRadioHistory. blogspot.com site, KIKK-AM was originally launched in 1946 as KRCT at 650khz by executives at the Goose Creek Daily Sun. LeRoy Gloger bought the station in the '50's, and changed the call letters to KIKK in May 1961, broadcasting from the old Montagu Hotel at Fannin and Rusk.

I came to KIKK-AM in 1999 to launch Business Radio 650, and in 2008 returned to the station as an entrepreneur, establishing the Talk650 Morning Show. Cynthia Fodell-Mott and Nick Nicholson approached me this Fall about bringing live Radio back downtown, with a series of broadcasts beginning January 21, 2011.

With all the advances in technology—you can now hear Talk650 on your smartphone—live Radio still holds a romantic appeal to people: Sending your voice over the airwaves in real time. I hope you will join us for our inaugural show from The Members Lounge for breakfast, conversation, and entertainment live on the Radio!
